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Texas Medicaid Provider

To be eligible for Texas Medicaid reimbursement, a Provider must be approved by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission and enrolled with Texas Medicaid & Healthcare Partnership (TMHP).

 Providers can use the online Provider Enrollment and Management System (PEMS) tool to enroll electronically through the TMHP website at <u>tmhp.com</u>



Benefits, Limitations and Exclusions

Providers should verify benefits, limitations and exclusions located in the Texas Medicaid Provider Procedures Manual at <u>tmhp.com</u> prior to rendering services. Always refer to the most recent publication.

In addition, prior to submitting services for reimbursement Providers should refer to the most recent publications of the:

What is Fraud, Waste and Abuse?

Fraud

- Fraud is an **intentional** deception or misrepresentation made by a person with the knowledge that the deception could result in some unauthorized benefit to himself or some other person
 - It includes any act that constitutes fraud under federal or State law

Waste

• Waste includes any practice that a reasonably prudent person would deem **careless** or that would allow **inefficient** use of resources, items, or services



What is Fraud, Waste and Abuse?

Abuse

- Abuse means Provider practices that are inconsistent with sound fiscal, business, or medical practices and result in an unnecessary cost to Medicaid or CHIP program, or in reimbursement for services that are not medically necessary or that fail to meet professionally recognized standards for health care
 - It also includes client practices that result in unnecessary cost to Medicaid or CHIP Program



Reporting Fraud, Waste and Abuse

The Texas Health and Human Services Commission <u>Inspector General</u> (IG) is responsible for investigating Medicaid fraud, waste and abuse in Texas Health and Human Services programs.

Fraud, Waste and Abuse Examples

Examples of Fraud, Waste or Abuse:

- Getting paid for services not rendered or necessary
- Letting someone else use their Medicaid or CHIP ID
- Not telling the truth about a medical condition to get treatment
- Not telling the truth about resources he or she has to get benefits
